



FACTS ABOUT TENNESSEE HOUSE DISTRICT 53

- The best way to CONTROL an individual is to keep them Blind, Hungry and Dependent on you!
- VOTER APATHY is indicated by low voter turnout during elections. Historically the lowest voter turnout comes from alack of interest of constituents due to disappointment, lack of information and disorganization
- Over the last six years the above status has been a constant for House District 53....
- It's time for a CHANGE



GUIDING PRINCIPLES FOR "VOTER PRECINCT GOVERNANCE"

Consent:

The basis for governance on any level is the expressed will of the people.

Education:

Prior to casting any ballot, a voter should be "reasonably" informed about the electoral process, candidates and issues facing them.

Registration:

There should be a process in place to ensure that all eligible voters of a respective precinct are properly registered to vote in an election.

Participation:

There should be a process in place to encourage and ensure that all eligible voters of a respective precinct have reasonable access to the poll site, and the opportunity to vote in elections.

Communication:

There should be a process in place to maintain an open line of communication between elected officials and constituents of the respective voting precinct.

Accountability:

Prior to, during the campaign cycle and after the electing of an official, there should be a documented agreement among the elected official and the Precinct Governance Council's Executive Board that the elected official will honor the will of the voters and the P.G.C.



PRECINCT GOVERNANCE COUNCIL: "DEFINITIONS OF RELATED CONCEPTS"

Governance Council - an organized gathering of residents (voters) to address issues of importance to their neighborhood (s) and the community as a whole.

Policy Agenda – written and approved guidelines for representing the interest of residents of voting precincts within political boundaries.

Senate District – the largest political boundary of the Tennessee General Assembly, where voters are assigned to an elected official to represent their interest in the Senate.

House District – the second largest political boundary of the Tennessee General Assembly, where voters are assigned to an elected official to represent their interest in the House of Representatives

Council District - the geographic and political boundary set by the Metropolitan Government for constituents (voters), represented by an elected councilperson .

Voting Precinct - the smallest division of constituents (residents) within the political boundary of a Council District . Eligible voters within a given council district are assigned to a location (site) where they cast their vote in an election.





PRECINCT GOVERNANCE COUNCIL "GENERAL AIMS"

- To offer constituents guiding principles on voter education, registration and participation
- To establish bylaws for the governance of a voting precinct council
- To build and maintain constituent membership/participation
- To engage in strategic planning and the execution thereof
- Maintaining a process for choosing a candidate/official for elected office on the local, state and federal levels



ORGANIZATION OF A "PRECINCT GOVERNANCE COUNCIL" (P.G.C.)

- Forming an assembly of respective voting precinct residents
- Electing officers
- · Establishing a by-laws committee
- Reading of proposed by-laws before the assembly (1st, 2nd and 3rd.)
- Adopting by-laws for the Precinct Governance Council



PRECINCT GOVERNANCE COUNCIL "ECONOMIC AGENDA"

Creation of a four-year strategic plan for economic empowerment of residents who are unemployed or under employed. Such planning will include, but not be limited to:

- Cooperative Economic Development Initiative
- Business planning and start ups
- Acquisition of community funding mechanisms



PRECINCT GOVERNANCE COUNCIL "EDUCATIONAL AGENDA"

Creation of a four-year strategic plan for the educational advancement of adult residents and children in public schools. Such planning will include, but not be limited to, the establishing of a 21st Century Community Learning Center with an emphasis on:

- Offering family education
- Training on parent involvement in schools
- Providing opportunities for adult continued education



PRECINCT GOVERNANCE COUNCIL "SOCIAL AGENDA"

Creation of a four-year strategic plan for improving the quality of life for all residents of the precinct governance council. Such planning will include, but not be limited to, identifying neighborhood-based solutions to

- Address criminal behavior at it's root cause
- · Offer social and emotional support to families and youth
- Ensure property protection
- Form a community and district wide treaty


IMPOSING A HOUSE DISTRICT 53 "TERM LIMIT"

INITIATED ONLY BY THE STATES."



While there is no state law governing term limits for the Tennessee Legislature, the organized consent of any and every Precinct Governance Council (P.G.C.) within the house district can impose a rule among its members that determines how many times voters will vote for a candidate or incumbent. It is effectively enforced by:

- Maintaining a collective voter precinct agreement
- Codifying this rule via bylaws of each P.G.C.
- Ensuring proper education of P.G.C. voters







- Organize a get-out-to-vote
 operation in each voting precinct
- Schedule to "mass-vote" at designated poll location (s) during early voting
- Document voter actions during early voting
- Hold joint or precinct specific voting rallies throughout the election cycle
